New Caledonia French Study Trip

Congratulations to all our staff and students that took part in the New Caledonia Trip over the term break. Reports indicate that everyone had a wonderful time immersing themselves in the culture and the French language. Needless to say the weather was outstanding, the activities extremely engaging and the behaviour of the students faultless. Once again, the trip received 'thumbs up'. Sporting Precinct Development

We are on the cusp of starting the development works with relation to the Sporting Precinct Project. You may have noticed that the perimeter of the front oval is now secured by temporary fencing and the site has now become a building site. The Contractors are just waiting for the signing of a couple of documents and the work will then begin. The builder's site sheds will be delivered and located on site on Thursday, after students have arrived at school

I informed the student body on Monday morning that the start of the work is imminent and that for the next 165 days at least, we will need to be more tolerant and accepting of one another as we move through the school. We need to be kind and understanding because about a third of our school grounds will not be available for us to move around in. There is the possibility of some congestion but I know that with the students' willingness and support, all will go well. As student numbers decrease over the next few weeks with the seniors finishing, comfort will increase for all of us who will be here until close to the end of December.

I ask parents for your support in reiterating this message to our young people. I think that we need to acknowledge that we will need to go through a little bit of discomfort in order to achieve an outstanding end product that will not only serve us well for years but also serve our community.

I will keep you informed as work progresses from week to week.

Changes to parking on the north side of Withers way

There have been changes to the parking areas on the north side of Withers Way across the road from the entry into the school. With the completion of Leisure Centre redevelopment four parking bays have been converted into a bus-parking zone. This is to support the new entry into the Leisure Centre that has been designated a school entry. From 9:00am to 3:00pm, this area is purely a bus-parking zone. Between 8:00am and 9:00am, this area is a school drop off zone (5-minute Stop). Between 3:00pm and 4:00pm, this is a school pick up zone (5 minute Stop).

I encourage you to use the drop off and pick up zone but also to adhere to the time restriction. Council Officers have been patrolling and it would not be unusual for them to issue parking fines.

I ask you for your support on one matter relating to student safety. If you do use the drop off and pick up zone on Withers Way can you please direct your children to cross the road at the school crossing both on arrival and on their departure from school. As you well know, congestion is high at peak times and we do not want to complicate things by students, crossing the road in front of incoming cars and placing themselves at risk.

Thank you for your support with this matter.



During Term 3 two Year 8 classes participated in a pilot with the Banyule-Nillumbik Tech School. Over three consecutive days the students grappled with a focus on the War on Waste. Using the inquiry framework and innovation process the students went from collectively identifying a problem to creating storyboards on touch-screen computers, and by the final day were using technology to create cardboard prototypes of a product, many of which were 3-D printed. Facilitated by the Tech School staff, the students appreciated the opportunity to apply an industry approach to particular problems. There will be one more class participating in this pilot program in Term 4, and in 2019 we are planning for all Year 8 classes to be involved as a part of their curriculum.



The RACI Victorian Branch Titration Competition results - More success!

Our two teams in the completion: Nathan Wall (Year 12, Stewart House), Charlie Evans (Year 12, Everard House), Ben Phillips (Year 11, Andrew House), and Noah Field (Year 11, Andrew House), Zac Broeren (Year 11, Everard House), Paddy Leahy (Year 11, Stewart House) were both invited to proceed to take part in the National competition, only 35 teams are chosen from the 322 participating teams from all over Victoria to advance to the National competition.

Students in this year's competition were again asked to determine the strength of a solution of ethanoic acid (acetic acid or vinegar) of unknown concentration. They first had to determine the concentration of a sodium hydroxide (caustic soda) solution by titrating it against a known volume of hydrochloric acid of known strength, and then using the caustic soda solution, to determine the strength of the acetic acid solution. Students worked in teams, and each team was given three different solutions of sodium hydroxide and ethanoic acid

Our two teams completed their tasks for the National Competition and obtained the following awards:

One of our students, Manu Ranganathan took part in the first Student Accelerator Program provided by the Banyule Nillumbik Tech School and Melbourne Innovation Centre.

Student Start-Up is multi-partner accelerator program designed to help students grow their exciting ideas into a business.

The Program provides students with access to seed funding, leading mentors, workshops, pitch events and the latest business incubation facilities at Melbourne Innovation Centre's Greensborough campus.

Manu completed the program towards the end of term 3, and gave us this insight:

"Over the last 5 weeks, myself and group of four other students from Melbourne's North met every Monday at Melbourne Innovation centre for the start-up program. This program was led by the CEO of Melbourne Innovation centre, David Williamson, and Brett Melville, who is a successful business owner and entrepreneur. The purpose

of the program was to turn an idea into a profitable business, and we started from the basics, all the way up to creating our first prototype, and pitching out businesses to investors and successful business owners.

I learnt heaps about business and what it takes to become a successful entrepreneur on this program. We had the opportunity to talk to many highly successful business owners, have one on one sessions with various mentors, and were given seed funding throughout the program to develop our businesses.

As mentioned before, at the end of the program, we were given the opportunity to pitch or business concepts to an audience of business owners and investors. The event was a great experience and I really gained an insight into the way successful business owners think and operate.

My pitch went really well on the night, and an investor offered me \$3000 with ongoing mentorship for 2.5% of the business.

The start-up program will most likely be open to another group next year and I would highly recommend anyone to give it a go. I will be a part of the next start-up group, returning as a program mentor."




