PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Continuing Our Work Together

The strength of our community has always been consistent throughout times of challenge and I know that you will agree with me when I say that this is the thing that has allowed us to move forward with hope and resilience.

The Premier's announcement Tuesday morning, in relation to the extension of the lockdown for a further 7 days, I am certain would have incited the response of "Well...here we go again", and whilst this would have been a natural and even probably fair response, we have all actually approached this period of lockdown with a higher level of confidence and with a level of knowledge of what we can expect.

As such, the current plan for remote and flexible learning remains in place for all students. The existing model of onsite learning will remain in place for students whose parents are authorised workers, vulnerable students and for any students with a disability who also fit one of the two previous categories.

Teachers will be touching base with their students through their classes. Involve/Tutorial/Integrated Studies teachers will also be checking in on students.

Can I ask all parents/carers to work with us to support all of our young people. We have done this well before and we can do this again, so please, if you are becoming concerned about your child's wellbeing and/or engagement with their learning please inform the school by making contact with contact the relevant sub-school team leader. In a timely manner. The sooner we become aware of issues the sooner we can put support structures in place.

I also put out a call to all students to take some responsibility for their wellbeing as well and ask them to seek help if they experience negative feelings and/or find it difficult to engage with their learning.

They can do this by reaching out to their parents/carers, their sub-school team leader or co-ordinator or a teacher they feel most comfortable with.

This week you will receive an email from your child's Integrated Studies teacher outlining the learning program for the term with some suggestions about how you might like to get involved as a family.


We hope that these activities will allow for time away from the screen and some creativity in the down time at home.

Students undertaking a VCE Unit 3/4 study are requested to access the VCAA website for information pertaining to the end-of-year written and performance examination periods. The link is provided below.

Students should note the following:

- Students should check the starting time of each examination and arrive at least 30 minutes earlier, and be familiar with rules about late admission to examinations.
- The start time for the afternoon session on Friday 29 October, Monday 1 November, Tuesday 9 November and Wednesday 10 November – when only two sessions are scheduled is 2:00pm.
- The start time for the afternoon session on all other days when three sessions are scheduled is 3:00pm.
- The reading period is included in the times shown in the timetable. Each examination commences with a 15-minute reading period unless otherwise specified.
- All written responses must be in English, unless otherwise instructed in the question book for that particular examination.
- If students are presenting for Performance examinations, Languages examinations oral component or the Extended Investigation oral presentation they will be issued with individual examination advice slips. Photo identification and examination advice slips must be presented for entry to their assessment. In some cases, students in regional and rural areas may be required to attend venues in Melbourne.
- The following written examinations have an audio component: English as an Additional Language (EAL), Music Performance, Music Style and Composition, VET Music Industry: Sound Production and all Languages including Chinese Language, Culture and Society, except Indigenous Languages of Victoria, Classical Greek, Classical Hebrew and Latin.
- The VCAA 2021 Exam Navigator booklet will be published in term 3 and will be distributed to each student once it becomes available.

Regardless of restrictions, Banyule Youth Services continues to provide support to young people, families/carers and schools via online and digital platforms. We are committed to maintaining connection that enables us to find creative ways to keep schools informed and young people supported.

Banyule Youth Services offer support for young people in the following contexts; one-to-one support, group social/interest based programs and school workshops.

Banyule Youth Services prides itself on using harm minimization approaches that seeks to build connection and knowledge.

We also have weekly groups that young people can be a part of!

Jets is our creative art facility and is home to various youth programs aimed to build community connections across all young people including those who may be marginalized.

School Workshops Built Upon Harm Reduction Approaches.

As you would all know all of Banyule Youth Services workshops are completely free and have been developed in response to needs identified by students and teachers.

Body Image - Combating Negativity

Our body image workshop explores online and offline influences that may be negatively impacting young people. This workshop is appropriate for all genders and unpacks the different messages portrayed by the media, advertisements and social norms. This workshop discusses the potential emotional, physical and social harm that can occur as a result of beauty "trends" and practical ways that young people can protect themselves whilst building positive self-concepts.

Safe Partying

The Safe Partying Workshop provides accurate and palatable information surrounding Alcohol and illicit substances – including risks associated with using/combining them. This workshop explores harm reduction strategies that young people can consider when planning to attend or host a party, paired with steps to take if things get out of control. This workshop provides valuable tools and resources for young people who may soon be attending schoolies or whom may be already exploring drinking and/or substance use.

Bullying and Social Harassment

Our newly developed Bullying and social harassment workshop unpacks factors leading to bullying, social harassment and violence alongside and explores how it can occur.

This workshop has a strong focus on raising awareness of how bullying negatively impacts all persons including perpetrators, victim/survivors and bystanders. The workshop outlines the short and long term impacts experienced by these groups and practical way peers and bystanders can help stop bullying and aid bullies to get the support they need to stop. This workshop focuses primarily on bystander/peer intervention and personal awareness.

Road Smart is a road safety education program for Year 10 students in Victoria, funded by the Victorian Government and delivered free for schools and TAFEs. The program has been developed in accordance with the Victorian Curriculum and draws on relevant research for school-based road safety education and change. It includes:

- 60-70 min in-class session delivered by a trained facilitator at schools (we have also developed an "online" option, delivered by our facilitators, into the classroom or while students are learning remotely)
- Learning modules for students and supervising drivers
- A free practical driving session delivered outside of school hours
- A teacher resource toolkit linked to the Victorian Curriculum.
- All Road Smart Facilitators have completed COVID-Safe training and practice safe hygiene procedures.


