Banyule Youth Project in Social Media:

I congratulate **Nathan Gunn** (Year 7, **Andrew House**) and **Georgia Nethercote** (Year 12, **Andrew House**) for their involvement in the "It's There For Life Program". Both students contributed to the making of a powerful resource for young people and in so doing represented our school admirably. In the following Nathan reports on his experience in taking part in this initiative.

"Last school holidays myself and about 15 other students from the Banyule area worked with industry professionals, and were given a theme revolving around the internet, as part of their "It's There For Life" program. There were 2 students from Eltham High who were part in this - myself, and Georgia Nethercote (Year 12)

We started with research, finding out what the most common cyber issue among teens was. We came to the conclusion that sexting was a very common issue, which we need to work towards stopping. Next, we worked on concept development, with storyboard artist Jeremy Ley. We sketched up about 10 different ideas for our film, came down to 2 - which two teams worked on, and made more interesting. We then voted on our favourite, and started working on that.

We called actors, hired buses, borrowed houses, and prepared everything - including the script, call sheets, budgeting sheets and the storyboards.

Day 1 was filmed at a house in Thornbury, and Day 2 we shot all our outdoor scenes in Macleod. All together we only spent 7 days planning, filming, editing and then Marketing and Distribution. We think we created a pretty interesting film - showing the pitfalls of social media and its many different features.

- All students must arrive to the exams on time.
- All exams commence with a 5 minute reading period except for English (10 minutes).
- The English exam is two hours in length- concluding at 3.45 pm.
- General Maths Methods and Maths Methods have two exams- 1x1 hour and 1x 90 minutes.
- VET Certificate II- Kitchen Operations has 2 assessment requirements- a 45 minute exam and a 90 minute practical assessment- all other exams are 90 minutes in length.
- All exams will be held in the Performance centre except for specialist exams e.g. Music; VET studies.
- The examination timetable will appear on your Compass schedule by the end of this week; please check the room allocation carefully once this is updated on your schedule.
- You must adhere to the examination rules as they are formulated according to VCAA and Eltham High School requirements.
- Students are to assemble in the foyer area of the Administration building outside the Performance Centre 10 minutes prior to the start time of each examination.

Unit 3 subjects/classes during the Year 11 exam period:

The student is required to attend Unit 3 classes during the examination period.

In the event of a clash with a Year 11 exam:

If a Year 11 student is undertaking a Unit 3 study (Year 12 subject), he/she is required to attend the Year 11 examination on the scheduled day and liaise with the Year 12 class teacher to complete the tasks undertaken during this time. The absence will be recorded as 'approved'.

A scheduled Year 12 Unit 3 SAC/SAT during the exam period:

Year 11 students undertaking a Year 12 study who have a scheduled Unit 3 SAC/SAT during the exam period are required to attend the Year 12 SAC/SAT assessment and re-schedule the Year 11 examination to either the 4th or 5th June – Session 3. Students are required to access the link below to complete this process.

Unable to attend an examination due to a clash in the timetable:

If a student is unable to attend an examination due to a clash where two studies may be timetabled simultaneously the student is to select which examination to undertake on the scheduled day and re-schedule the second exam to one of the two times available during the exam period (Thursday 4th or Friday 5th June, 2015- session 3). Students are required to access the link below to complete the process.

Unable to attend an examination due to illness:

If a student is unable to attend an examination due to illness (a medical certificate must be supplied) and the examination re-scheduled to one of the two times listed during the exam period. Students are required to access the link below to re-schedule one of the exams to Thursday, 4 June, 2015 session 3 OR Friday, 5 June, 2015 session 3.

Steps to follow:

1. Parent/guardian is required to contact the school to inform of student absence
2. The student must access the link below to re-schedule their examination(s) to the 4th or 5th June.

VCE Examination rules

Timetable clashes:

If a student has **two examinations timetabled for the same session**, one of the examinations will be moved to another session on the same day. Schools may consult the student and, on their behalf, request which examination is to be moved to a different session. **Note: VCE Languages and Music written examinations cannot be moved to a different session.**

Senior School requests students impacted to see their respective coordinator and identify which examination is requested to be moved.

Students with three examinations timetabled on one day:

The VCAA will permit students who have three examinations timetabled on one day to have an additional 10 minutes per hour extra time for the final examination on that day. This may be taken as extra working time or as supervised rest breaks. Students are not obliged to utilise the extra time entitlement and are permitted to leave the examination prior to their revised finish time.

Students who complete three examinations in a single day are entitled to receive a Derived Examination Score (DES) for the third examination. These students will not be required to apply for a DES.

To be eligible for the DES, students must attend all three examinations on the day and attempt the questions on the paper to the best of their ability.

Eltham High School: Year 10 Examination Rules

It is important that Year 10 Exams are conducted according to the rules, as specified by Eltham High School.

All students need to ensure that they are familiar with all requirements expected during exams.

General:

Please check the Year 10 Examination timetable for your allocated Exam times. Arrive at school early and ensure that you know the correct location of your examination room.

The doors of the examination room will be opened 10 minutes before the starting time for the examination. You will not be allowed to leave the examination room until the end of the scheduled finishing time for each exam.

Students must bring to the examinations their own writing equipment, erasers, ruler, etc. These must be carried and stored in a **clear plastic pocket**.

Pencil cases and bags are not to be brought to the examination room.

Students may not bring to the Examinations mobile phones, iwatches or other types of music or electronic communication devices.

The school approves students bringing bottled water into an examination room with the following conditions:

- The water is in a clear plastic bottle (no label)
- The bottle has a secure lid
- The capacity of the bottle is no more than 1500 ml
- The water bottle **must not be placed on the desk** at any time
- Water bottles must be not re-filled during the examination
- Water bottles must not be shared between students

Conduct at Examinations:

Please take particular note of the following rules.

During any examination you must not:

- have in your possession any book or notes or blank paper (apart from the materials distributed for that examination) or any other resources that would improperly help you in your work. An exception applies to physics mathematics or subjects which allow the use of bound resources during examinations.

During any examination you must not:

- have in your possession any electronic device (including mobile phones and electronic dictionaries) apart from calculators (for those subjects in which they are permitted);
- directly or indirectly help any other student;
- permit any other student to copy from or otherwise use your papers;
- directly or indirectly accept help from any other student;
- use any papers of any other student;
- behave in a manner that disrupts other students.

Use if Dictionaries:

If you require the use of a dictionary in the examinations you must provide your own.

The use of dictionaries in examinations is subject to the following conditions:

- A dictionary may not contain any additional material that may help you in the examination of the subject concerned.
- The supervisor at the examination room has the authority to inspect your dictionary.

Use of Calculators:

Students must use the approved calculator in their mathematics examinations. Please ensure that you bring your own calculator with a fully charged battery. **No batteries or calculators will be supplied during the exam.**

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.




