### // PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Student Achievement

##### Victorian Volleyball Schools' Cup:

A big congratulations to the students of all the teams that represented the school at the Victorian Volleyball Schools Cup this year, as well as all of their coaches, a number of which are past students of the school and past participants of the program.

Whilst the overall school results are not yet official, we believe that, once again, Eltham High School is the overall winner of the Victorian Volleyball Schools' Cup.

The teams came back to school with three gold medals, three silver medals and four bronze medals. In addition to this, four teams placed fourth, two fifth, one sixth and one eleventh. Specific results are available in a further section of this newsletter.

This is a great achievement and once again I congratulate all the students for their effort, their dedication and commitment to the sport.

#### Past Student Achievement

Congratulations to **Lachlan Dalglish** (Class of 2014, **Andrew House**) and winner of the Cadel Evans Award, 2014 on his selection for the NOVA Employment – Short Film Festival "Focus on Ability" which is a National Film competition running for the seventh consecutive year. Although Lachie graduated from Eltham High School last year, he is entering the festival as a representative of the school.

The Festival, aims to raise an awareness of people with a disability by focusing on their abilities rather than on the disability. Over \$100, 000 worth of prizes will be allocated to winning schools.

The competition will culminate in an awards night held in Sydney (date yet to be announced). Entrants will have the chance to feel like Scorsese and see their films premiered on the big screen as well as the chance to have their film shown on national television.

The intent of the Year 9 program is to provide the greatest level of student choice and at the same time provide a curriculum that is both innovative and engaging. A curriculum review was undertaken in 203-2014 and a new curriculum structure and content was developed for the start of 2015. Alongside this is all the work that staff has undertaken through the school's PD program, enhancing instructional practice for a better delivery of the curriculum.

I urge all Year 8 students and their parents to attend the evening.

## Victoria – The Education State – Consultation Reminder

Just a reminder, the consultation process relating to Victoria - The Education State will conclude at the end of July.

### School and Beyond Program

Dear Parents/Gardians

The School & Beyond program will provide funds for young people aged 12-24 years in 2009 fire affected communities to support their engagement and retention in education, vocational training and employment pathways. Whilst the program aims to benefit individuals, funding will be provided to services rather than directly to individuals, ensuring support can be directed to those most in need as identified by those working closely with them and in a timely way.

Eltham High School is able to submit an Expression of Interest to be a School & Beyond Program partner. Organisations approved as Program Partners will be able to submit requests for funds to support young people, as needed, and requests will be considered monthly.

Examples of eligible items include: books, uniforms, travel costs (where this is the primary barrier to participation); Funding for tutors to support students; Course or program fees (where not subsidised); Travel; A program or activity which aims to engage a group of young people in education, training, or employment pathways and which builds their vocational and personal skills, such as a Barista training course or job interview skills.

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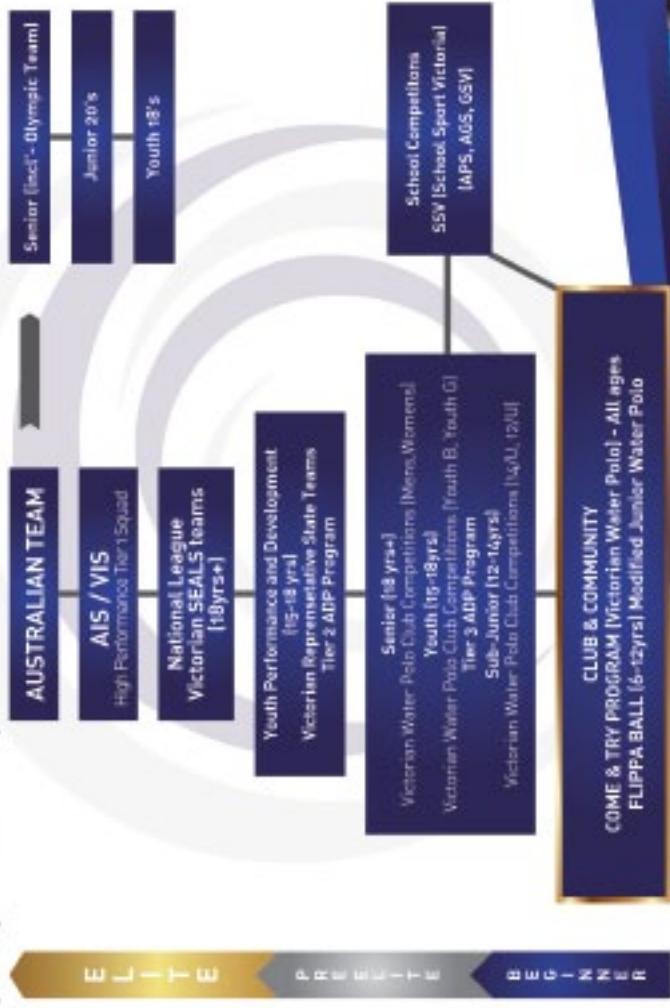
