Victorian Government's Technical School Initiative

You will have heard in the Media that the Labor State Government, as part of its election promises, has made a commitment to the establishment of a number of Technical Schools across the State. I want to begin this by saying that what is being considered falls outside of the mould of the traditional "Technical School" model which the name itself and our past experiences of this terminology may define. Instead, a number of Centres of Technical Innovation and Excellence are proposed and are aimed at enhancing students' learning experiences from those gained within the school setting. One such Centre has been designated for the Banyule area; however, it is most likely that this Centre will in fact be established within the heart of Nillumbik.

At the same time the Government has voiced a commitment to the re-opening of a number of TAFE Colleges, which were closed under the previous government. One such TAFE is the Greensborough Campus of what is now Melbourne Polytechnic.

The Government has decided to take advantage of these two election promises and gain as much benefit out of them that it can, hence marrying the reopening of the TAFE and the establishment of the "Technical School". As a result it is proposed that the new Technical School be located on the Melbourne Polytechnic Greensborough site.

There is a great deal of work yet to be done and a large number of decisions to be made before this comes to fruition.

I was very fortunate to attend a meeting this morning hosted by the Banyule Nillumbik Local Learning and Employment Network (BNLLEN) which was attended by the newly appointed CEO of Melbourne Polytechnic, Mr Robert Wood. Robert's vision for the TAFE and the Technical School initiative was very pleasing to hear. He spoke with passion for supporting the needs of the community and was very aspirational about what can be achieved through genuine partnerships with the community. I got the sense that he was genuine in his approach and in his willingness to want to engage various sectors of the community, not the least schools, to ensure that what is established within our reach meets the needs of a variety of different learners. It was very refreshing to hear what Robert had to say and I look forward to engaging in a further conversation with him.

As for the Technical School initiative, the Eltham High School Council has been kept informed and wants to hear more about the direction this will be taking. We are most certainly interested in being involved as a way of supporting and enhancing the learning of our young people. Darren Squires (Assistant Principal) and I will be attending a workshop next Wednesday morning and I will be more than happy to continue to keep you informed of the plans as they take shape over the next few weeks and months. All I can say at present is "Watch this space!"

Year 7 City Camp Program

I was very privileged to meet up for dinner with the first group of Year 7 students on Camp last week. It was fantastic to see the level of enthusiasm amongst the students, as well as the staff. Feedback from all the students was extremely positive and they expressed great appreciation for the hard work of the organizers who spent endless hours to make sure that everything went off without a hitch. On the other hand, the staff was extremely positive about the students, their approach to the various activities and their general demeanour and behaviour. Once again I was very proud of our students and of the program. I take this opportunity to congratulate first and foremost the students, and subsequently all members of the Junior School Team under the leadership of Jodie Sutton for their organisation of the Camps Program and all the staff that participated on the various days. The Camp most certainly supported the learning that takes place back at school.

Year 12 - Open Days 2015:

La Trobe Vice Chancellors Excellence Scholarship for 2016:

This will be awarded to a high-achieving student who is expected to be in the top 10 per cent of their Year 12 student cohort, based on Year 11 results and Semester 1 results in Year 12.

Applicants are to register their interest in the scholarship with their Careers teacher. The application process opens up in early term 3 and more information will provided at that time.

YEAR 9 - Year 9 Work Experience 2015 - Monday, 7 - Friday, 11 December:

Students are required to complete one week of placement from Monday, 7 – Friday, 11 December. Students have been provided with forms electronically, but can also obtain copies from outside the Careers office. There is the standard Placement Form along with a Transport/Accommodation Form, if necessary. They have also been provided with a list in PDF form of previous employers (by occupation) to assist in finding a placement.

Please note, students who are not 15 years old will be restricted to placements at a kindergarten, pre-school or primary school. Alternatively, private arrangements can be made by the family in seeking a placement.

For students competing in the Australian Volleyball Schools' Cup, they are able to complete their placement prior to the scheduled week.

School and Beyond Program

Dear Parents/Gardians

The School & Beyond program will provide funds for young people aged 12-24 years in 2009 fire affected communities to support their engagement and retention in education, vocational training and employment pathways. Whilst the program aims to benefit individuals, funding will be provided to services rather than directly to individuals, ensuring support can be directed to those most in need as identified by those working closely with them and in a timely way.

Eltham High School is able to submit an Expression of Interest to be a School & Beyond Program partner. Organisations approved as Program Partners will be able to submit requests for funds to support young people, as needed, and requests will be considered monthly.

Examples of eligible items include: books, uniforms, travel costs (where this is the primary barrier to participation); Funding for tutors to support students; Course or program fees (where not subsidised); Travel; A program or activity which aims to engage a group of young people in education, training, or employment pathways and which builds their vocational and personal skills, such as a Barista training course or job interview skills.

- An 8 metre section of post and pipe fence needs to be assembled inside the main courtyard to provide protection for a newly constructed garden completed in 2014.
- Approximately 430 new plants will be provided with new homes in the area adjacen to the cricket nets. These plants will need to be staked and guarded.
- Approximately 15m³ of mulch needs to be barrowed around the new plants above.
- Plants that were the focus at recent plantings in 2014 and early 2015 need to be checked for weed invasion, as well as securing any staking that may have since come adrift.
- Weeding and pruning of plants on the south side of the 400's as well as weeding between the 800's and 900's.
- Pressure cleaning of the pavers and concrete in the area adjacent to the cricket nets.
- Moving and brush cutting in a large range of locations across the campus precinct.
- Paving around the remaining boxed garden adjacent to the Stadium.

If you are intending to support this event on Sunday, 23 August please park your vehicle on the hard courts adjacent to the Stadium and then follow the directional signage to the Canteen area where you will be signed in by a member of the Grounds Committee and directed to appropriate task. Please remember to bring protective clothing, gloves and substantial footwear.


