**A Focus on Our School Values**

**Basketball Dream for the Vision Impaired:**

Year 9 student **James Lindrea's** (Year 9, **Everard House**) passion for basketball has driven him to develop his dream of creating a basketball team for the vision impaired. In a nutshell this is the story. "James and his mother embarked on this one year ago and have been working around the logistics. James asked his mother at the age of ten whether he would be able to play basketball when he was older if he was blind. He asked is there a blind basketball team. At the first meeting with representatives from Blind Sports Australia they nattered out with James how a vision impaired basketball team could operate. In this meeting they discussed what the team needed, how the rules would work, where it could be held and how to create a campaign around generating interest.

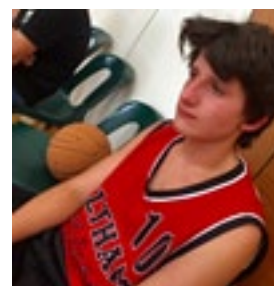

He did this by describing his own basketball world along with what it's like being isolated from sports as a result of special needs. Basketball Australia was very keen to listen and is very supportive in assisting James and Blind Sports Australia work in a partnership for its creation! This has enormous potential to develop into a national sport and James' dream is to develop its potential internationally once established here!



At this stage, this process begins with starting a Blind/Vision Impaired Basketball clinic during the school holidays, determining a suitable venue and raising awareness for the concept to work its magic.

Victoria University students are also able to offer support and advice with international research.

I congratulate James on his initiative and I look forward to hearing about his success and the opportunities that his dream will provide for those who love taking part in the sport of basketball but who each day live with vision impairment.

**Volleyball Team Selections for 2016:**

Selections for Eltham Volleyball teams have been held and most teams selected. Over the next few weeks students will receive a note about payment that should be made to the Cashier by the end of Term One.

**Year 7 Volleyball:**

We have selected many students to take part in the Year 7 Volleyball Round Robin competition; all will train for that competition. After that, 16 boys and 16 girls will be selected to take part in the Volleyball program that will run during the year. Although it is preferred that students be under 14 for the whole of Year 7, selection is based on ability.

**Change of Date:** The Year 7 Volleyball competition is to be held on Monday, 21 March; the same day as tennis, softball and baseball. **Students can only take part in one of these sports as they are held on the same day.**

**Volleyball Competitions:**

The following volleyball opportunities will begin over the next couple of weeks at Eltham High.

On **Monday, 15 February** a Year 7 competition began. It will usually cost \$3 each week to play. The first week was a free 'come and have a hit' night where kids could join and enter teams for the competition that would start the following week. Games start at 3.25pm in the Sports stadium and usually finish by 4.00pm. This social competition is open to all Year 7 students; **students can still join.**

On **Thursday, 25 February** we have 2 competitions starting:

**Year 8 – 12:** At 3.25pm the Eltham Volleyball competition for students in Year 8 -12 will start with a free night when students can enter teams for the competition that will begin the following week. ## // WORKING BEE

### Working Bee: Sunday, 21 February

A solid 50 plus parents, students, past parents and teachers attended the first Working Bee for 2016 on Sunday, where all tasks planned were addressed in a comprehensive manner. Thanks to all those who attended the event, especially The Grounds Committee members who supervise tasks and provision the volunteers with morning tea and barbeque lunch.

Listed below are the tasks that were completed at the first Working Bee on Sunday.

- 3m<sup>3</sup> of soil was barrowed into the internal courtyard in the 100s block and made ready for planting out at the next Working Bee.
- Hundreds of bags and stakes were removed from plants in the vicinity of the Performance Centre and cricket nets.
- Both of the areas above were systematically weeded and watered.
- 50 new Correas were planted in the area adjacent to the cricket nets, then staked and bagged.
- Pruning and weeding was completed in the area between the 800s and 900s.
- Pruning and weeded was completed in the area adjacent to the tennis courts and Withers Way.
- Brush cutting and mowing was completed in a range of location across the campus precinct.
