I take this opportunity to congratulate Doug Whittaker on his retirement. Doug has been a member of our Science Faculty for a number of years and his work as one of the Laboratory Technicians has been much valued and appreciated. We wish Doug all the very best as he begins this next phase of his life.

It was great to see students and staff arrive this morning with smiles on their faces looking forward to catching up with friends and colleagues and ready to get into the work.

A good deal of work took place over the break starting with the replacement of the Year 7 lockers. I have to commend all of our Year 7 students who have been amazing and following through with all of our requests and making the transition into the new lockers appear as seamless as possible.

You will also notice that the temporary fencing that has been in place around the school for some time has now been replaced with permanent black fencing. This will add to the security of our school as well as add to the visual aspect of the site.

Our preferred method of payment for excursions and school based activities is via Compass. If payment is made via an alternative method, please ensure that you consent via Compass once payment has been received by the school.

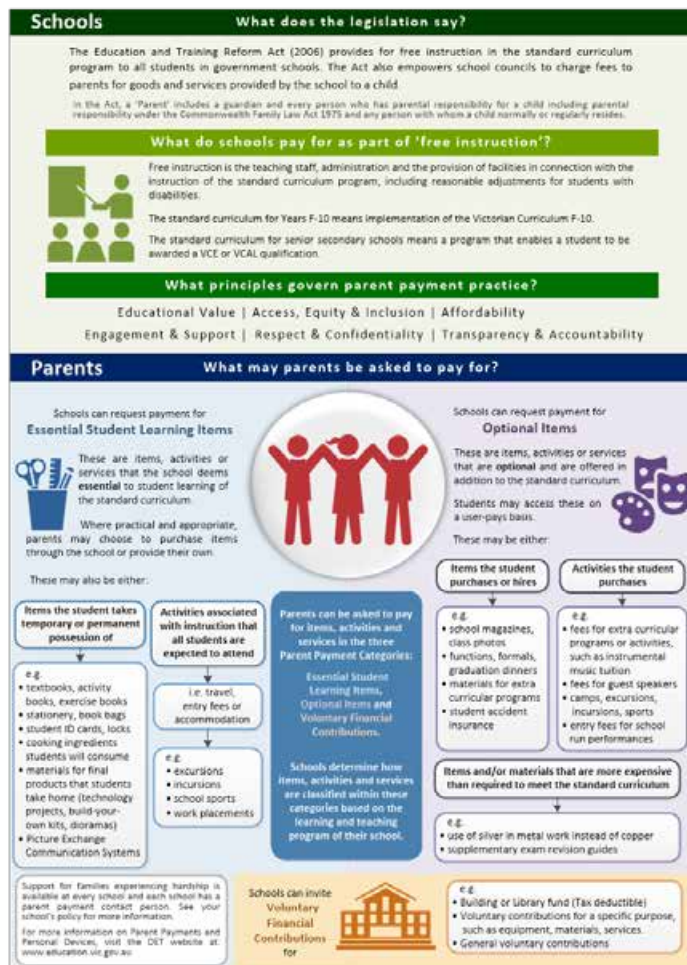

Payment of Program Fees

Understanding school refusal

School refusal is when a student stays home from school due to emotional distress about some aspect of attendance, with permission from their parent. Overcoming school refusal requires families and schools to work together towards a common goal - improved attendance.

Dr Glenn Melvin is an Associate Professor with Monash University's Centre for Developmental Psychiatry and Psychology. He is a former director and clinician for the School Refusal Program at Monash Medical Centre.
